The RoundUp App

As a Veteran's Service Organization our American Legion Post 237 has an obligation to provide first-class services to our North Alabama Veterans. To create a first-class service organization our Post needs a consistent revenue stream that will fund the necessary budget items for our Veterans and enable us to support our charitable programs.

Our Post Finance Office has investigated and vetted one resource to put our Post on a track to self sufficient funding. The RoundUp App is an easy way for our members and supporters to help fund our Post and service budget. The RoundUp app can be downloaded on your PC, phone or tablet. There are no initial costs to use the RoundUp app.

The RoundUp program will round up each purchase on a linked card to the next dollar for the purchases you make within the month. For example if you spend \$10.25 at the hardware store, the app will round up that purchase by 75 cents to \$11. At the end of the month the app will deposit all of your round ups into our Post account less a 1% service fee.

The RoundUp App will work on any valid credit or debit card on all purchases made with that card. A normal credit card user will end up making between \$10 and \$20 in donation to the Post every month. If we have only 200 members contributing \$10 per month with this program, we will net \$1,800 per month after deducting the 1% RoundUp service fee. Users can establish donation limits on the app, make one-time donations and easily send a link to friends and family who may want to help us.

Your personal credit information is not stored within the app and RoundUp has no access to that information. The app uses the financial transaction company Stripe to validate your information. Stripe is used by many of the larger e-commerce corporations.

Veterans can download the RoundUp app and easily setup an account. If you need assistance with download the app or establishing an account please contact the Finance Office. We will make ourselves available to help you set up your account.

Madison County's 1st Place winner, Christine Johnson, will participate on 12 February 2022 in the Alabama American Legion District 12 contest, to be held also at Madison City Hall.

Each student presented very enlightening perspectives and knowledge on aspects of the U.S. Constitution. Congratulations to all the students who represented the best of Madison City/County schools.

The National American Legion Contest, which has been held annually since 1938, helps students grow in leadership ability, their capacity to think and speak clearly and intelligently, and in understanding the rights, responsibilities, obligations and privileges of U.S. Citizens. and culminates in late April at the National Convention to be held in Indianapolis, Indiana.

A Message from the Chaplain

John 3:1-17

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish ruling council. He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the miraculous signs you are doing if God were not with him." In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the Kingdom of God unless he is born again." "How can a man be born when he is old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!" Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the Kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows wherever it pleases, You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit. "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked. "You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? I tell you the truth, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven – the Son of Man. Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

Nicodemus was a great teacher, a great professor, a very rich man, and he asked Jesus some spiritual questions. And Jesus said to him, Nicodemus you are a great man but you lack one thing. You must be born again.

Allow this comment, I believe in this concept and perhaps you do as well. To be born again is a spiritual concept of allowing yourself to be humbled to realize you are born into this world through sin and that sin must be accounted for. After age of accountability where one is old enough to understand a simple prayer for forgiveness of all sin allows our Lord to come into your heart and save your soul and give you unto Salvation. According to Scripture this act is followed up with water baptism but not before. It can be submersion as the Baptist and other believe or a simple sprinkling as other religions practice. Not a difficult concept but it can be challenging if you have never been exposed to this sort of teaching. I say to you my beloved, even if this concept is foreign just remember that God does forgive sins and simply bending a knee to acknowledge our God will put you on the right path. May God bless the reading of his word and provide all those who read this blessings of love and insight.

2022 Alabama Boys State

American Legion Alabama Boys State is a leadership program for young men who have completed their junior year of high school and are active in the community and are outstanding students. Boys State provides delegates with working knowledge of how governments function on the city, county and state levels. We believe that there is no better way to assure the survival of our republic than to train our young people in the ideals and objectives of the American government.

Although it is several month away we are preparing for the 2022 American Legion Alabama Boys State convention at Troy University from May 29 through June 4, 2022. Our Post has historically sponsored needy students. We have conducted an orientation session and dinner to prepare delegates for the convention. We have provided a breakfast for bus riders, and bus transportation to and from the Boys State convention for delegates from Madison County. We team with the other American Legion Posts in the county to recruit students and educate school administrators on the content and benefits of the Boys State program.

Our students have been very successful at Boys State, with two Governors in the past 3 conventions and a national Vice President in 2021 hailing from our county. In 2019 we had over 70 delegates and the combined class of 2020 and 2021 produced more than 70 delegates from Madison County. Representative Anthony Daniels was able to provide a grant in 2020 which allowed us to help fund Boys State scholarships for young men from our county. We were able to use that grant money for deserving students from the 2020 and 2021 classes.

We raise money to support our Boys State efforts primarily through our Legion Post 237 and Sons of the American Legion Squadron 237 weekly bingo games. As you can imagine, Covid has taken a serious toll on our bingo operations over the past two years so our available funds are low. Also the cost of the two trips to and from Tuscaloosa went from \$2100 in 2019 to over \$3100 in 2021. With the additional mileage to and from Troy, we expect our transportation costs to exceed last year's. We are awaiting bus quotes from several vendors to confirm that supposition. We also expect that more students will be requesting transportation due to the increased travel distance to Troy vs. Tuscaloosa along with rising fuel prices.

We need your help. We can afford to conduct most of our usual activities related to Boys State, the orientation and meals and a few scholarships. However, we will have to curtail our bus transportation unless we can find sponsorship to help with those expenses. We are actively soliciting local companies. If you work for a company that might consider sponsoring some of our Boys State expenses please provide me with contact information so that we can send a solicitation letter. You can reach me at:

Henry E. 'Red' Erwin

Red Erwin was born on May 8, 1921, in Adamsville, Alabama. He enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve on July 27, 1942, and entered the Aviation Cadet Program of the U.S. Army Air Forces on February 3, 1943. After being eliminated from pilot training, PFC Erwin was assigned to the 603rd Training Group at St Petersburg, Florida, from June to July 1943, and then to the 305th Technical School at Keesler Field, Mississippi. He then completed the Radio Operator and Mechanic School at Sioux Falls, South Dakota, in February 1944, followed by advanced training at Truax Field, Wisconsin, in April 1944.

His next assignment was as a B-29 Superfortress radio operator with the 52nd Bomb Squadron of the 29th Bomb Group at Dalhart, Texas, from April 1944 to February 1945, and then deployed to the Pacific Theater from February 1945 until he was badly injured while flying his 11th combat mission aboard the B-29 "City of Los Angeles" on April 12, 1945, during a mission in which he would later be awarded the Medal of Honor.

After undergoing many surgeries for his burns, he received an honorable discharge on October 8, 1947. He and his wife Betty were married on December 6, 1944, and had one son and three daughters together—Hank, Bette, Nancy, and Karen; as well as eight grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Red Erwin served with the Veterans Administration for over 30 years after leaving active duty, and died on January 16, 2002. He was buried at the Elmwood Cemetery in Birmingham, Alabama. His son, Hank Erwin, has served as an Alabama state senator since 2002. →

His Medal of Honor Citation reads:

He was the radio operator of a B-29 airplane leading a group formation to attack Koriyama, Japan. He was charged with the additional duty of dropping phosphorescence smoke bombs to aid in assembling the group when the launching point was reached.

Upon entering the assembly area, aircraft fire and enemy fighter opposition was encountered. Among the phosphorescence bombs launched by S/Sgt. Erwin, 1 proved faulty, exploding in the launching chute, and shot back into the interior of the aircraft, striking him in the face. The burning phosphorescence obliterated his nose and completely blinded him. Smoke filled the plane, obscuring the vision of the pilot.

S/Sgt. Erwin realized that the aircraft and crew would be lost if the burning bomb remained in the plane. Without regard for his own safety, he picked it up and feeling his way, instinctively, crawled around the gun turret and headed for the copilot's window. He found the navigator's table obstructing his passage. Grasping the burning bomb between his forearm and body, he unleashed the spring lock and raised the table. Struggling through the narrow passage he stumbled forward into the smoke-filled pilot's compartment. Gropping with his burning hands, he located the window and threw the bomb out.

Completely aflame, he fell back upon the floor. The smoke cleared, the pilot, at 300 feet, pulled the plane out of its dive.

S/Sgt. Erwin's gallantry and heroism above and beyond the call of duty saved the lives of his comrades.
