At our Post's General Membership Meeting on February 20, 2023, a motion will be made for the membership to approve that Article IV, Section 10d should read: "The One Year Trustee shall be Chairman of the Post Board of Trustees."

This amendment notification will also be posted on the bulletin board in the social quarters of our Post.

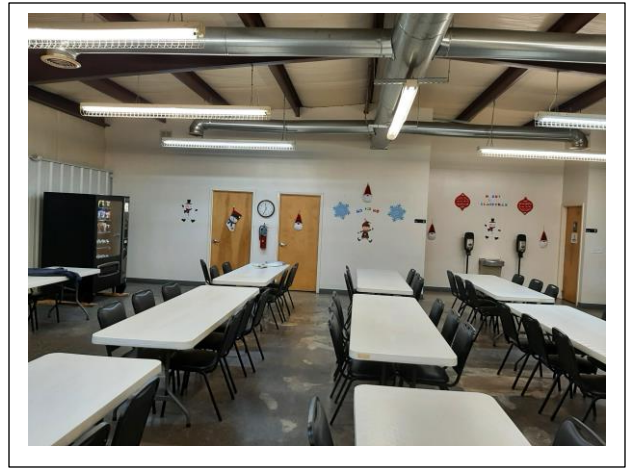

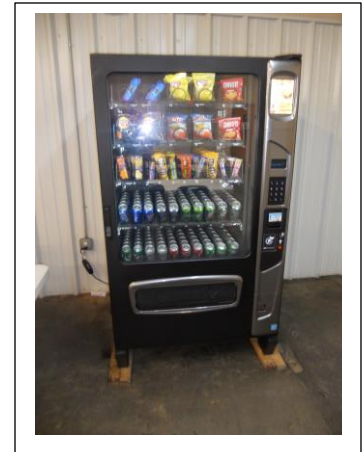

ARMY NURSE CORPS: MORE THAN 120 YEARS OF SERVICE TO OUR NATION

Since 1901, Army nurses have demonstrated again and again their total commitment to the highest standards of military nursing excellence. Both men and women have served as Army nurses since 1775, but the Army Nurse Corps did not become a part of the Army Medical Department until February 2, 1901. The distinguished contributions of female contract nurses during and following the 1898 Spanish-American War became the justification and demonstrated the need for a permanent female nurse corps.

When the United States entered World War I in 1917, there were only 4,093 nurses on active duty. By November 1918, there were 21,460 Army nurses, with 10,000 serving overseas. During the war, nurses served primarily in base, evacuation, and mobile surgical hospitals in France, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the Philippines. They also provided care on hospital trains in France and transport ships carrying wounded home across the Atlantic. Approximately 270 nurses lost their lives in the conflict.

At the outbreak of World War II, fewer than 7,000 nurses were on active duty. By 1945, more than 57,000 Army nurses were assigned to hospital ships and trains, flying ambulances, field hospitals, evacuation stations, and general hospitals. In Europe, Army nurses assisted in developing the concept of recovery wards for immediate postoperative nursing care. Nursing gained a greater understanding of the process of shock, blood replacement, and resuscitation. Air evacuation from the combat zone by fixed wing aircraft brought patients to treatment quickly. Army flight nurses helped to establish the incredible record of only five deaths in flight per 100,000 patients. Nurses endured hardships caring for their patients. In May 1942, with the fall of Corregidor in the Philippines, 67 nurses became Japanese prisoners of war. During the thirty-seven month captivity, the women endured primitive conditions and starvation rations, yet they continued to care for the ill and injured in the internment hospital. On Anzio, nurses dug their foxholes outside their tents and cared for patients under German shellfire. Their example bolstered the spirits of the soldiers who shared the same tough experience. By wars end, 215 brave nurses died for their country. →

Army nurses once again played a major role in support of combat troops when President Truman ordered United States forces into Korea in June 1950. Army nurses cared for combat troops during the landing on Inchon; the advance across the 38th parallel into North Korea; the amphibious landing on the east coast of Korea, the drive toward the Yalu River; and the retreat to the 38th parallel. Throughout the Korean War, 540 Army nurses served on the embattled peninsula.

Mobility and increased patient care characterized service in Vietnam. Evacuation by helicopter brought wounded to medical units located within minutes flying time of the battlefield. Army nurses aided greatly with trauma care which saved so many lives after they were transported to Army hospitals in the United States. In Vietnam, of the nearly 5,000 Army nurses who served in forty-four hospitals, eight of them made the ultimate sacrifice for their nation.

During Operation Desert Storm, approximately 2,200 nurses served in forty-four hospitals. Two of every three Army nurses in the Arabian Gulf were from the Army National Guard or Army Reserves.

Recent years have seen Army nurses active throughout the world both in armed conflicts and humanitarian endeavors. In 1983 they supported combat troops in Grenada; in 1989, in Panama; and in 1991 in the Middle East. Since 1995, Army nurses have been deployed with medical units in support of NATO troops in Haiti, Bosnia, and Kosovo.

Throughout its history, the Army Nurse Corps has earned the deep respect and gratitude of the American people because of its dedication to providing the best possible care to our soldiers and their families while serving our country in war and peace. Army nurses have unselfishly come to the aid of victims of disaster and disease throughout the world. There is one constant associated with Army nurses---their devotion to provide the best possible nursing care.

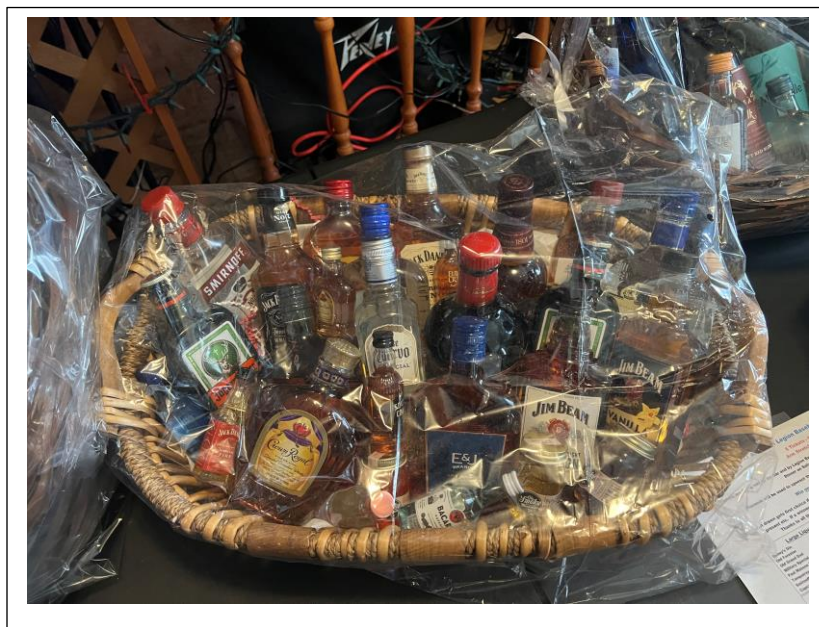

From June 2021 through March, 2022, your Post Honor Guard, consisting of volunteers, has provided this service to more than ninety families. In addition, the Honor Guard performs flag ceremonies for various civic affairs, such as Memorial Day, and other requested services.

This memorable service is provided to veteran's families at no charge, and receives no funding from outside the Post membership. The annual costs (transportation, vehicle maintenance and insurance, etc.) for the Honor Guard is approximately \$5,000 per year. Please assist your Honor Guard.

Please note on the check or the envelope that the donation is intended for the Honor Guard. The Post 237 Honor Guard is now classified as a 501C3 organization and its official name is The American Legion - Alabama Post 237 - Honor Guard.

Honor Guard Call to Arms

The Post 237 Honor Guard has dwindled down to about half as many members as it once had. Over the past few years, deaths, members moving away, medical issues or just plain old age has taken its toll on the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard has been able to maintain operations without denying any request for services, but at times we have had a limited number of available members. In the past two years we have provided over 200 military funerals, averaging about two per week. We are on call seven days a week. Many of our members have full time jobs and can participate only on the weekends, leaving the full-time retirees to fend for the weekdays. We combine efforts with the Post 229 Honor Guard to fulfill the funeral requests and maintain a perfect record. Our goal is to have enough members to rotate so that no one person must do all the funerals. We need your help to make this happen.

If you feel duty bound to pay your respects to veterans in their passing, join the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard will issue you a summer and winter uniform with all accessories. All you have to provide is your American legion cap and a pair of black shoes. Transportation from Post 237 to the assignment and back is provided by the Post 237 van. The rifle salute uses M1 Garand rifles of WWII vintage that have been restored.
