Women in the Military

Post 237 is very proud of its Honor Guard and what it has already accomplished throughout the years and will continue to accomplish to support the military veterans in Madison County and surrounding communities. In order for the Honor Guard to continue performing its invaluable mission, your support is necessary and requested.

HONOR GUARD MISSION: To provide military funeral honors for deceased veterans who have served honorably in the United States military.

SERVICE AREA: The Honor Guard services Northern Alabama and Southcentral Tennessee. In 2024, the Honor Guard supported 176 veteran's funerals and community patriotic events, traveling 1832 miles to do so. As the funeral services provided by our Honor Guard become more widely publicized, the number of funerals and mileage driven to support them will significantly increase.

OPERATING EXPENSES: The annual cost of outfitting Honor Guard members with uniforms, procuring needed equipment/supplies, weapons and van maintenance and insurance for the van is \$5,880.00.

A Message from the First Vice Commander, Rob Satterwhite

Happy New Year to our Post 237 Legionnaires, SAL, and Auxiliary. I wanted to take this opportunity to inform you of a cause I have taken up on behalf of a veteran friend who has been personally impacted by the below information. I am asking you to take a couple of minutes to read this information and contact our Senators (linked) for additional government funding to find a cure for this horrible, and aggressive disease. The contact forms are very straight-forward and should only take a couple of minutes to complete. Feel free to copy/paste the paragraph below into the appropriate field when contacting our Senators.

You may not be aware, but military veterans are much more likely to be diagnosed with ALS than the general population. Within a typical population of 100,000 people in the US, there are approximately two new ALS cases each year. Air Force veterans are shown to be diagnosed at a rate of 33.2 per 100,000 and Tactical Operations Officers (e.g., pilots, aircrew, and missile combat operations officers) in the Department of Defense had significantly higher ALS prevalence at 51.8 per 100,000. This clearly shows there are existing environmental triggers that could cause a dramatic increase in ALS prevalence. If the triggers are not determined, the general population could also become exposed to similar triggers and cause a similar 25-times likelihood of acquiring ALS. Estimates showed the number of cases of ALS in the world will increase from 222,801 in 2015 to 376,674 in 2040, representing an increase of 69%. Awareness of how this disease is impacting our veterans is a must for our elected officials, as is making funding a top priority to stop, and/or control ALS.

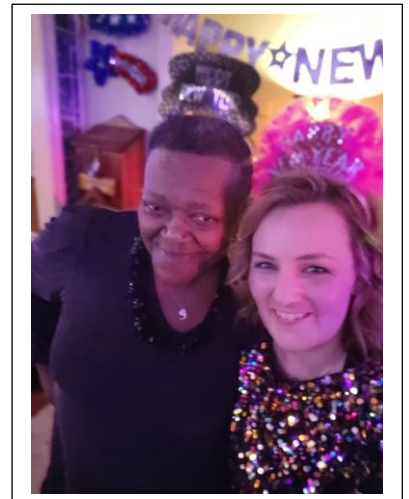
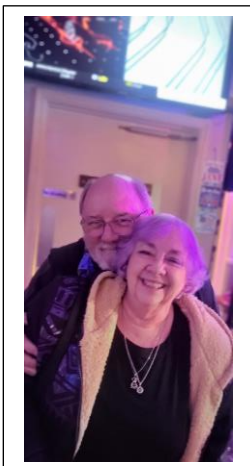

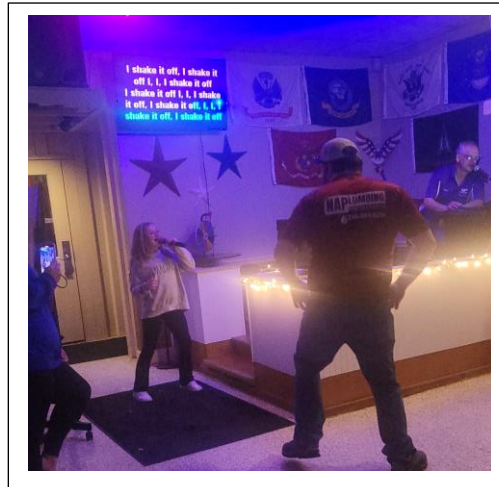
