Following Stubby's Example

The retired Army chaplain opened his Memorial Day speech by sharing the anecdote about Stubby, the famous dog of World War I. In 1917, when a soldier named Robert Conroy was shipped overseas with the 102nd Infantry, he smuggled Stubby onboard. Even though he had no training, Stubby was a good soldier. Once, a German spy tried to sneak into camp. Stubby attacked the intruder. He wouldn't let go until the Americans captured him.

Another night, Stubby barked incessantly, waking up Conroy and the other sleeping soldiers. The Germans were launching a gas attack! The men quickly put on their gas masks. Stubby's warning had saved their lives. Sometimes, Stubby raced through the deep trenches carrying messages attached to his collar. In between battles, Stubby cuddled up next to wounded soldiers. He licked their faces. He tried to cheer them up. Grateful soldiers pinned their own medals and ribbons on his collar. French nurses made him a special little blanket to wear. Soon that was covered with medals too.

After serving in seventeen battles together, Conroy and Stubby returned to the United States. Stubby was famous! He was given a silver medal that read, "Awarded to the Hero Dog Stubby."

Stubby became an honorary member of the American Red Cross, the YMCA and the American Legion. In the years following the war, he met Presidents Woodrow Wilson, Warren G. Harding and Calvin Coolidge. He took part in more parades than any other dog in the world. In 1925, Stubby became very sick. He died in the arms of the soldier who had rescued him years before.

As I listened to the chaplain, I realized that like Stubby, I don't need special training to be of assistance to others. I can lend a hand or lend an ear. I can offer comfort and a casserole. Simply by caring and paying attention, I can be a blessing to others.

Lord thank you for providing people and animals in my life who give comfort and help. Help me to offer the same to others. Amen.

Nick Jones will remain the Veteran Service Officer, Mary McCoy will remain the Adjutant, and Bud Pagakis will remain the Finance Officer. These officers are also members of the Post Executive Committee.

A brief overview of each position follows:

Commander: Presides over the Post meetings, supervises the business affairs of the Post, serves as Chief Executive Officer, provides an annual report and list of newly installed officers to the State. Chairs the Executive Committee.

1st Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander assume his duties. The 1st Vice Commander is responsible for the Post membership drive.

2nd Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander and the 1st Vice Commander, assume their duties. Is responsible for the Americanism programs i.e. Oratorical Contest, Boys State, ROTC, etc.

3rd Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander and the 1st and 2nd Vice Commander, assume their duties. Chairs the House Committee and supervises the Club Management.

Chaplain: Promotes the spiritual welfare of the Post. Offers divine non-sectarian services at Post events. Chairs the Visiting Committee.

Historian: In charge of records and incidents of the Post and its members.

Sergeant-At-Arms: Preserves order at meetings, serves as Post color bearer.

Two and Three Year Trustee: Serve for two or three years. Along with the One Year Trustee assist with Post budget, enforce Post financial policy, conduct an annual Post inventory and are custodians of Post property. One Year trustee chairs the Building Committee. ❖

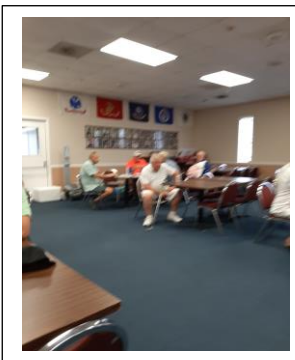
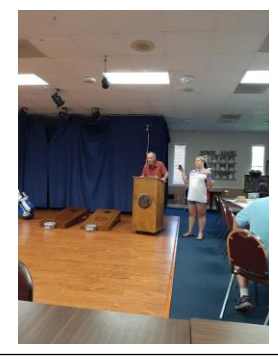
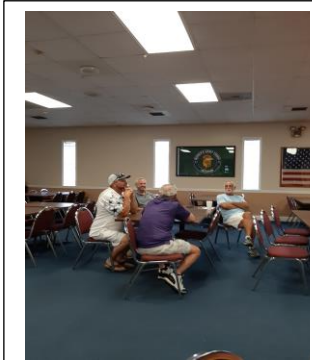
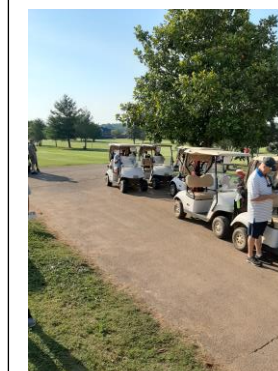
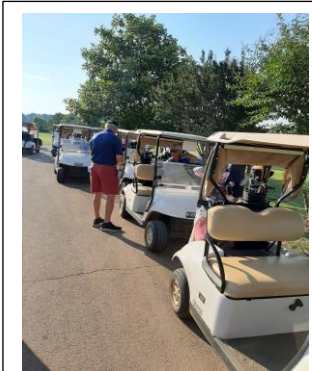
2nd Annual American Legion Post 237 CHARITY GOLF TOURNAMENT

Alabama County Veterans Service Offices Reopen

MONTGOMERY, Ala. – The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs (ADVA) has reopened the department's county-based veterans service offices that were temporarily closed in response to the COVID-19 emergency.

Most county offices are providing services by appointment-only, and because of on-going preventive measures and due to limited space in some offices, walk-in appointments are suspended until further notice. Some veterans service offices are located in county facilities that remain closed to the public; however, a veterans service officer will be available at these facilities to take calls and assist veterans and their dependents. The ADVA and its county offices continue to follow preventive measures such as wearing masks and maintaining social distancing. For in-office appointments, the county offices will follow protocols for protecting both employees and veteran clients.

"Our county veterans service offices offer a vital service to our veterans and their family members, and we're taking necessary steps to reopen the offices to deliver services while following protective measures that are in the best interest of public health and safety," said ADVA Commissioner Kent Davis.

The ADVA operates 51 county veterans service offices, and as part of a 2019 initiative to expand services, the ADVA will open 9 additional county offices in 2020. The department's objective is to have a veterans service office in all 67 counties to serve the state's more than 400,000 veterans.

The county veterans service offices assist veterans and their dependents with compensation and pension claims, educational benefits, VA home loans, and referral services for needs such as temporary housing, healthcare, counseling, and job placement.

Redstone reopens limited services in support of phased employee return

REDSTONE ARSENAL – Redstone Arsenal will reopen select services in support of tenant organizations' phased approach to returning employees to the installation starting Tuesday, May 26.

Redstone Arsenal leadership remain focused on three priorities: safeguard the health, safety and security of the workforce; combat and prevent the spread of COVID-19; and carry on the critical missions of each of our organizations.

Organization leaders will communicate with their workforce on their timelines and approach to returning employees to the installation. The decision to return the workforce will be a progressive and measured process managed by each tenant leader, and based on authoritative data from the Alabama Department of Public Health.

While leadership has determined that the installation and 16-county commuting area surrounding Redstone has met the conditions outlined by the DoD and CDC for an average 14-day decline in new positive cases, the reconstitution of services and return of employees to the Arsenal will be slow and deliberate. Future increases in services will be contingent upon conditions remaining the same or continuing to improve.

Garrison will reopen the following limited services to employees and beneficiaries with social distancing and preventative measures in place:

Installation Access:

- OPEN: Gates 1 (Martin Rd E), 7 (Martin Rd W), 8 (Goss Rd), and 9 (Rideout Rd) will have all lanes manned during peak morning rush hour traffic
- CLOSED: Gates 3 (Redstone Rd) and 10 (Patton Rd) remain closed
 - One Stop: Open with limited occupancy, and some services by appointment only
 - Pershing Welcome Center: Open, most services by appointment only
 - Child Care Centers: Open to returning employees who are present patrons
 - Bicentennial Chapel: Open for individual worship only
 - Fox Army Health Center: Most services are open, entry screenings still occur, cloth face coverings required to enter the facility, refer to Fox website and social media for details
 - Morale, Welfare and Recreation: Golf Course, Flying Club, Auto Skills, Arts and Crafts, Limited Outdoor Recreation activities open
 - Post Restaurants: Open for Carry-out only (JAVA Café, Brooklyn's and Firehouse Pub remain closed)
 - Post Exchange/ Gas Stations: Open, masks required to enter
 - Commissary: Open, Retiree hours and purchase limits remain in effect, mask required to enter

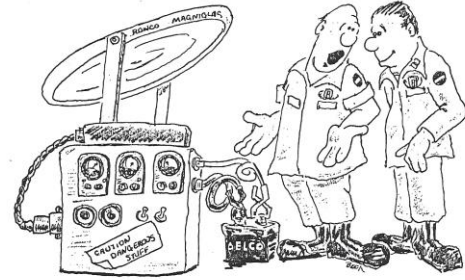

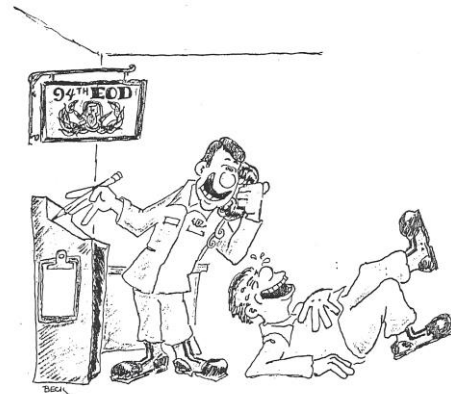
