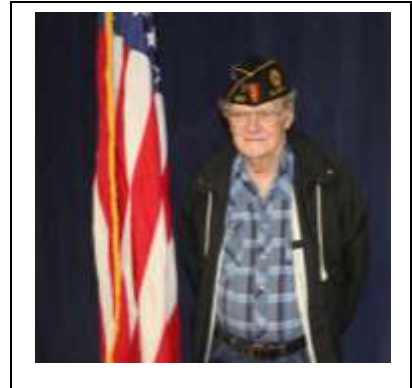

THE PARACHUTING PADRE

Among the 13,348 U.S. Army paratroopers jumping into Normandy, 13 were chaplains. One of them was Father Francis L. Sampson, who would go on to earn the Distinguished Service Cross, the Bronze Star, and the Purple Heart medals. He later wrote of his experience jumping into Normandy, "It will always remain a mystery to me how any of us lived. I collapsed part of my parachute to come down faster. From there on I placed myself into the hands of my guardian angel."

He nearly drowned when he landed in a swamp and his heavy 120-pound sack containing his combat and religious gear kept him down. He was able to get up for air with the help of a gust of wind and quick thinking with his knife. Sampson heard bullets zipping around him; he watched a frantic pilot steer a C-47 into a nearby field and disappear into a blast of orange fire and thick black smoke. He crouched and hurried alone, praying for each of the fallen he passed until he found fellow paratroopers huddled in a grove and joined them.

Sampson worked at an aid station caring for those who had been shot, blown up, burned, and disabled, and giving last rites to those who had passed. The Germans surrounded his position, and one German soldier pointed his pistol into Sampson's stomach and fired. The bolt clicked, but another German intervened after noticing the red cross on Sampson's left arm and cross around his neck.

He tended to 14 seriously wounded Americans and outlasted a night of a fierce artillery barrage. The four hour onslaught destroyed the house they were using for shelter. Sampson pulled the trapped men from the collapsed debris and administered aid, including a procedure involving blood plasma.

Later, during the Battle of the Bulge, he jumped into Holland, and the Germans searched at Bastogne with roving patrols and captured him. In more than 10 days, they marched 185 miles before they were forced into a train to deliver them to a prison camp.

Come December, Father Sampson was one amongst thousands of American prisoners of war. He led prayer twice a week, which helped boost the spirits of the prisoners. Sampson went on to have a successful military career and was promoted to the rank of Major General before retiring in 1971.

Outstanding students who are nominated by their schools and are rising seniors this year are invited to attend. Also, current seniors who registered for the cancelled 2020 session are also eligible to attend the 2021 session.

Registration for this year's rising seniors is open now! Application and liability forms and registration fee must be received at the American Legion Department of Alabama by June 30, 2021.

On June 29, 2021 Post 237 will host a joint 2020/2021 Madison County Boys State Orientation at the Post Annex. Yancy Mitchell, the Dean of Boys State Counselors, will be the guest speaker along with video presentations from the last two Boys State Governors. Both Governors, Mason Laney (2018) and Chris Baker (2019) are from Madison County.

The Sons of the American Legion Post 237 Chapter is sponsoring most of the expense of chartering a bus for transportation to and from the Boys State convention. The first 54 delegates who submit a request will be eligible for bus transportation.

In the past Bingo receipts have funded our Boys State scholarships and expenses. However because of Bingo closings and COVID restrictions, our funds are limited.

D-DAY HEROICS

JOHN J. PINDER, JR.

Rank and Organization: Technician Fifth Grade, U.S. Army, 16th Infantry, 1st Infantry Division

Place and Date: Near Colleville-sur-Mer, France, 6 June 1944

On D-Day, Technician 5th Grade John J. Pinder, Jr. landed on the coast 100 yards offshore under devastating enemy machinegun and artillery fire which causing his landing party to suffer severe casualties. Carrying a vitally important radio, he struggled towards shore in waist-deep water. Only a few yards from his craft he was hit by enemy fire and was gravely wounded.

Technician 5th Grade Pinder never stopped. He made shore and delivered the radio. Refusing to take cover or to accept medical attention for his wounds, Technician 5th Grade Pinder, though terribly weakened by loss of blood and in great pain, on three occasions went into the fire-swept surf to salvage communication equipment. He recovered many vital parts and equipment, including another workable radio. On the third trip he was again hit, suffering machinegun bullet wounds in the legs.

Still this valiant soldier would not stop for rest or medical attention, remaining exposed to heavy enemy fire, growing steadily weaker, he aided in establishing the vital radio communication on the beach. While so engaged this dauntless soldier was hit for the third time and killed. The indomitable courage and personal bravery of Technician 5th Grade Pinder was a magnificent inspiration to the men with whom he served.

Specialist 5th Grade John J. Pinder, Jr. was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for his actions on 6 June 1944.

A brief overview of each position follows:

Commander: Presides over the Post meetings, supervises the business affairs of the Post and serves as Chief Executive Officer, provides an annual report and list of newly installed officers to the State. Chairs the Executive Committee.

1st Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander assume his duties. The 1st Vice Commander is responsible for the Post membership drive.

2nd Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander and the 1st Vice Commander, assume their duties. Is responsible for the Americanism programs i.e. Oratorical Contest, Boys State, ROTC, etc.

3rd Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander and the 1st and 2nd Vice Commander, assume their duties. Chairs the House Committee and supervises the Club Management.

Three Year Trustee: Serves for three years. Along with the One Year and Two Year Trustees assist with Post budget, enforce Post financial policy, conducts an annual Post inventory and are custodians of Post property. One Year trustee chairs the Building Committee.
