Article VII, Section 1f of the By-Laws correctly states: "The Commander shall appoint the Chairman of the Building Committee."

At our Post's General Membership Meeting on February 20, 2023, a motion was made for the membership to approve that Article IV, Section 10d should read: "The One Year Trustee shall be Chairman of the Post Board of Trustees."

This amendment notification was also posted on the bulletin board in the social quarters of our Post.

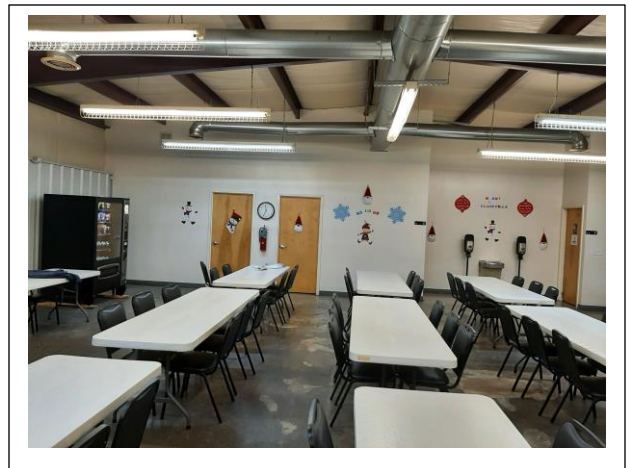

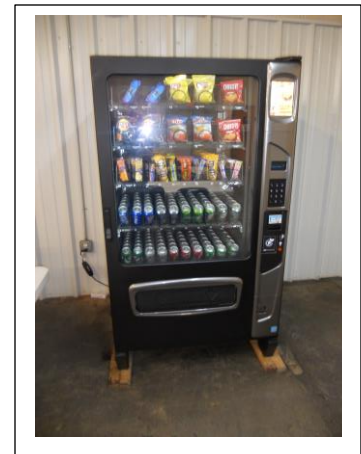

NATIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR DAY

March 25th is National Medal of Honor Day. To date, a total of 3,530 Medals of Honor have been awarded. Post 237 is proud to have as one of its members, Gary "Mike" Rose, who was awarded the Medal of Honor in 2017, for his actions during Operation Tailwind in 1970 in Laos.

Here are some interesting facts about some of the recipients of the Medal of Honor:

1. When White House staff tried to book a call from the President to Marine Sergeant Dakota Meyer to inform him he had been approved for the Medal of Honor for actions in 2009, the White House staff was informed Meyer was working a construction job and to call back during his lunch hour.
2. At the age of 14, Jack Lucas snuck onto a ship bound for Iwo Jima, stormed the beach without a rifle, and threw himself on top of two grenades to protect his team. He survived, and is the youngest person to earn the Medal of Honor at age 17.
3. Medal of Honor recipient Thomas Baker asked to be left behind during a Japanese counter attack on Saipan due to being wounded. He had a pistol with 8 bullets. After returning the Army found his corpse with 8 dead Japanese.
4. In 1965, Milton Olive III sacrificed his own life to save a group of soldiers by smothering a live grenade. He was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor, becoming the first African American of the Vietnam War to do so.
5. A B-17 bomber named Old 666 survived being attacked by 20 Japanese fighters for 40 minutes. The pilot and a gunner earned the Medal of Honor, the rest of the crew each received the Distinguished Service Cross. To this day, they're the most decorated American aircrew in history.
6. Medal of Honor recipient Master Sergeant Roy Benavidez had 37 puncture wounds, exposed intestine, broken jaw, and eyes caked in blood. He was pronounced dead until he spit in the face of a doctor who was zipping him up in a body bag.→

7. US Marine John Kelly was the last person to be awarded 2 Medals of Honor. He ran 100 yards in advance of the front line and attacked an enemy machine gun nest, killed the gunner with a grenade, shot another with his pistol, and returned with 8 prisoners. He was 19.
8. Lewis Lee Millett deserted the US Army when he thought they would not enter WWII and joined the Canadian Army to fight. After the US Army joined WWII he transferred back. In the Korean War he would be awarded the Medal of Honor for leading the last major Bayonet charge in American history.
9. US Navy SEAL Mike Thornton earned the Medal of Honor in Vietnam for saving the life of Thomas Norris, another SEA, who would also later receive the Medal of Honor for a previous rescue mission, making it the first time a Medal of Honor recipient saved the life of another Medal of Honor recipient.
10. James Okubo, a Japanese American who was in college when WWII started studying dentistry, was kicked out of college and sent to a Japanese internment camp in California for 2 years. He then joined the US Army as a medic and saved 25 men in a battle in 1944. He was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor.

2023 Oratorical Update

There were six contestants who presented their prepared oration on the US Constitution and their assigned topic oration on the VI Amendment. First Place winner was Christine Johnson. Second Place was awarded to Thomas Flemming and third place was awarded to Townley Hayes, Also participating in the contest were Gabe Etheredge and Sadie Sandlin.

On Saturday, February 11th the Division 12 Oratorical Contest was held at Post 15 in Decatur. Post 237 members Tom Paone served as Master of Ceremonies, Tom Hartley served as Judge, Thad Paone and Commander Jerry Phelps served as tabulators and escorts and Erin Paone served as runner and escort. Contestants were Christine Johnson who finished first and received a \$500 scholarship check, Samantha Simmons who finished second and received a \$300 check, and Ashlyn Brooke Jones who finished third and received a \$200 check.

On Saturday, February 18th the District 1 Oratorical Contest was held at Madison City Hall. Post 229's Dan Marr served as Master of Ceremonies. Post 237 members Jack LaFountain and Mary McCoy served as judges. Thad Paone served as timekeeper and tabulator and Tom Paone assisted as tabulator. Christine Johnson finished first and will represent District 1 in the Department contest on March 11th in Montgomery. Ms. Johnson was awarded a \$300 check. Finishing second and awarded a \$200 check was Sophie Blevins.

Old Business:

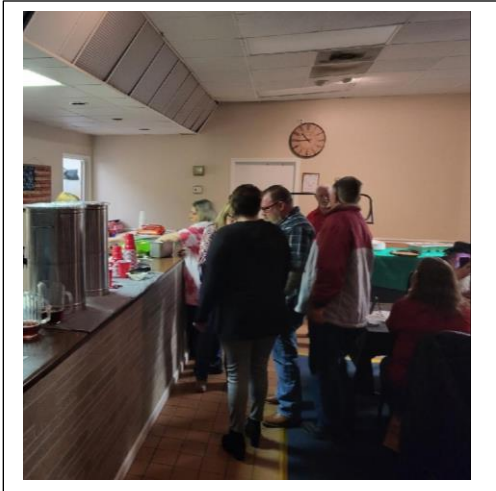

Boys State provides a unique opportunity for rising senior boys who are outstanding students and leaders in their schools to experience democracy at work, enhance their leadership skills, develop new friendships, and learn from Alabama political and business leaders.

The 2023 Boys State convention will be held at Troy University in Troy, Alabama starting Sunday May 30, 2023 and ending Saturday June 3, 2023.

Each applicant in Madison County is required to submit the Boys State to the Department of Alabama by May 15, 2023. Also the applicant should submit the 2023 Madison County Boys State Information Sheet to Tom Paone by May 12, 2023 if he wishes to attend the Madison County Boys State Orientation or to ride the bus transportation to Troy.

Delegates should plan to attend the Madison County Boys State Orientation at the American Legion Post 237 Annex on Tuesday, May 16, 2022 at 6:00 PM. The Post 237 Annex is located at 3806 Colonial Park Circle SW, Huntsville, AL 35805. Yancy Mitchell, Dean of Counselors, and past Boys State delegates will discuss what to expect and how to get the most out of the Boys State experience. We will also review the logistics and rules. Because of seating restrictions we ask each family to limit attendance at the orientation to the student and his parents.

The Huntsville American Legion Clayton E. Moneymaker Post 237 and Post 229 Honor Guard provide military funeral services for area military veterans. From June 2021 through March, 2022, your Post Honor Guard, consisting of volunteers, has provided this service to more than ninety families. In addition, the Honor Guard performs flag ceremonies for various civic affairs, such as Memorial Day, and other requested services.

This memorable service is provided to veteran's families at no charge, and receives no funding from outside the Post membership. The annual costs (transportation, vehicle maintenance and insurance, etc.) for the Honor Guard is approximately \$5,000 per year. Please assist your Honor Guard.

Tax deductible donations can be mailed to Alabama American Legion Post 237, P.O. Box 1176, Huntsville, AL 35807 or dropped off at the Post. Please note on the check or the envelope that the donation is intended for the Honor Guard. The Post 237 Honor Guard is now classified as a 501C3 organization and its official name is The American Legion - Alabama Post 237 - Honor Guard. Honor Guard Call to Arms

The Post 237 Honor Guard has dwindled down to about half as many members as it once had. Over the past few years, deaths, members moving away, medical issues or just plain old age has taken its toll on the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard has been able to maintain operations without denying any request for services, but at times we have had a limited number of available members. In the past two years we have provided over 200 military funerals, averaging about two per week. We are on call seven days a week. Many of our members have full time jobs and can participate only on the weekends, leaving the full-time retirees to fend for the weekdays. We combine efforts with the Post 229 Honor Guard to fulfill the funeral requests and maintain a perfect record. Our goal is to have enough members to rotate so that no one person must do all the funerals. We need your help to make this happen.

If you feel duty bound to pay your respects to veterans in their passing, join the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard will issue you a summer and winter uniform with all accessories. All you have to provide is your American legion cap and a pair of black shoes. Transportation from Post 237 to the assignment and back is provided by the Post 237 van. The rifle salute uses M1 Garand rifles of WWII vintage that have been restored.
