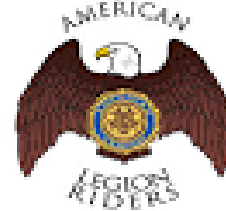

Greetings my fellow Legionnaires, Auxiliary, and Sons of the American Legion.

February has come to an end and spring is right around the corner. On that note, we need our unpaid members to spring forward and renew your dues so that we can get ready to close the Legion year off on a strong note.

As we start to close out the year, it means that it is time for me to name a nominating committee at the March membership meeting. If you would like to volunteer for this committee, please let me know beforehand. The committee will be responsible for reporting to the general membership the names of individuals that make their intention know that they are running for a Post officer position at the April's membership meeting.

Again, as the year starts to close, we need to get our unpaid members to please renew your dues as soon as possible. We were short roughly 15 members that were needed to meet our 90% goal at the department. We are currently at 88.7%.

It is hard to meet the department's membership goal with a post of our size. Where 2-3% of the 1274 members that we had last year is roughly 25-27 new/renewed members per month. Where a smaller post of 30 to 40 members, 2-3% for them is 2 to 3 members.

Three-Year Membership

Membership Dues for Legionnaires at Post 237 will increase to \$55.00 annually effective July 1, 2024.

If you renewed for the 2024 American Legion membership year prior to the new multiyear membership rollout on December 4th, you can take advantage of a three-year membership starting with the 2025 membership year which is July 1, 2024.

Visit legion.org/renew or legion.org/join for the multiyear membership of 2025, 2026 and 2027.

Legionnaires still needing to renew for 2024 or veterans joining for the first time can lock-in a three-year membership of 2024, 2025, and 2026. Visit legion.org/renew or legion.org/join.

Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the national American Legion website. Payment for the three-year membership will be upfront.

If a member renews before the dues increase on July 1, 2024, the renewal rate will be \$45.00 per year. Once the three-year renewal is up, the renewal rate will adjust to the rate at that time.

Hello, my fellow Legionnaires, Sons of the American Legion, and Auxiliary Members. I wanted to let you know about some of the upcoming events in March.

Canteen Renovations: We continue to repair and improve the Canteen. Several projects are scheduled to be completed soon.

Nighttime Kitchen Hours: We have returned to the normal operating schedule. We will be opening the kitchen on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. A nighttime menu has been developed.

The Battle of Iwo Jima

Iwo Jima was arguably the toughest battle the Marines had ever faced. The courage and sacrifice of the men who fought to secure the eight square miles of stinking sulfur rock and volcanic ash some put as 36 days of hell. It was named operation Detachment, the purpose was to take over two airfields.

Securing Iwo Jima prepared the way for the last and largest battle in the Pacific, the invasion of Okinawa. Nearly 7000 Marines were killed in this battle.

Awards – A total of twenty seven Medals of Honor were awarded for action on Iwo Jima. Both flags that flew on Iwo Jima today are located in the National Museum of the Marine Corps in Quantico, Virginia. Over 500 ships participated in this battle. And over 880 Navy personnel were killed.

We used the two airfields for emergency landings for B-29s. We would use these airfields throughout the rest of the Pacific war. More than 2,900 B-29 bombers were forced to land at Iwo Jima, saving the lives of 24,000 US airmen. It also became a staging ground.

The island is located some 75 miles off the coast of Japan. There are only a few survivors of Iwo Jima from the USA because they are over 100 years old.

NATIONAL VIETNAM WAR VETERANS DAY

In 2012, the President of the United States proclaimed March 29th to be Vietnam Veterans Day. The day was forty-seven years after the fighting in LZ X – Ray and forty-eight years after Everett Alvarez, Jr. became the first American pilot to be shot down and taken prisoner. The date was forty-four years after Marines fought house-to-house in the city of Hue and far too many years after service members returned home to a nation that was struggling to separate the war from the warrior. Signed into law in 2017, National Vietnam Veterans Day has been set aside as a day to honor the legacy of the millions who served our nation during the Vietnam War.

The conflict in Vietnam began with Americans advising South Vietnamese troops in combat and soon became a full-fledged war, even though there never was a formal declaration of war, Americans and their allies bravely stood, as their fathers had a generation before, and marched through unbearable heat, torrential rains, and the threat of a well-hidden enemy. Despite all of these challenges and more, American troops saw consistent military victories throughout the Vietnam War; defeating the Viet Cong during the Tet Offensive, which was the largest offensive to be mounted by the enemy, and continuing to win battles when they were, at times, greatly outnumbered. Service members showed time and time again that they were committed to protecting the liberties and freedoms enjoyed by so many Americans back home.

For the first time in history, Americans were able to watch the fighting from the Vietnam War play out on their television sets, both in Vietnam and on the increasingly violent streets of the United States. Chaos and uncertainty wreaked havoc in America, and yet in Vietnam grunts continued to hump through nightmarish terrain, pilots continued to fly missions, and nurses, doctors, and medics continued to heal young warriors. Service members continued to carry out their orders, showing bravery and resolve whenever the situation called for it. →

Throughout and after the Vietnam War, thousands of men returned home with physical injuries and many more later would come to suffer from exposure to Agent Orange and other toxins. More than 58,000 brave heroes paid the ultimate price for our freedoms, their names forever inscribed on the black granite panels of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. When Vietnam veterans did return, it was often an unpleasant homecoming. Name calling, leering looks, and frequent mistreatment were part of the experience. The parades of their father's generation seemed a thing of the past. This experience lit a spark among Vietnam veterans who worked together and made a commitment that the next generation of service members would receive the support and respect they deserved.

When it came time to send the next generation of men and women to war as part of Operation Desert Storm, it was the Vietnam veterans who stepped up to welcome them home; offering them salutes, handshakes, and parades for those now returning home from conflict zones. Vietnam veterans were saying "thank you for your service" and teaching their children, the next generation, to say it too. Through this work Vietnam veterans taught us the right way to treat the men and women in uniform who represent our country.

National Vietnam War Veterans Day is an opportunity for national reconciliation. It offers a chance for a now grateful nation to recognize the fortitude and commitment that Vietnam veterans showed and continue to show every day. March 29th is an opportunity to thank and honor the 2.7 million service members who served in Vietnam. For Vietnam veterans, this is a day when they finally receive the recognition and respect that was missing so many years ago. For everyone else, while we cannot go back and fix the mistakes of the past, we can work towards ensuring all Vietnam veterans receive the "**welcome home**" they truly deserve.

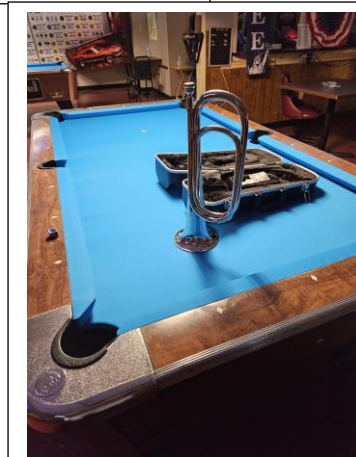
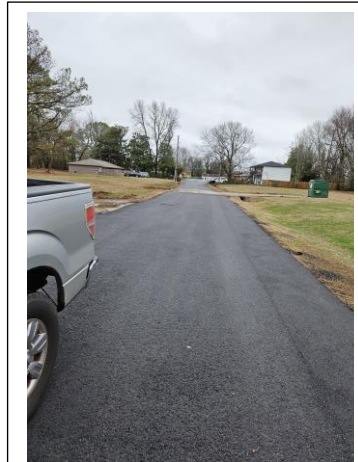


Around the Post
