Post Elections

The annual election of Post Officers has been postponed until Monday, June 15, 2020, the day of the June Membership meeting, from 12 noon until 6 PM. Elections are usually scheduled in May. However, due to the Coronavirus outbreak and Governor Ivey's Coronavirus Health Directive, nominations are delayed until the end of May and the installation of officers will occur at the June Membership meeting.

The following offices are up for election: Commander, 1st Vice Commander, 2nd Vice Commander, 3rd Vice Commander, Chaplain, Historian, Sergeant-At-Arms, and Three Year Trustee.

These officers, when elected, will also be members of the Post Executive Committee. The incumbent 1st and 3rd Vice Commanders, Sergeant-At-Arms and Chaplain have asked that their names not be placed in nomination for the upcoming election.

The Nominating Committee, chaired by Roy Hall and Tom Paone are soliciting names of Post 237 Legionnaires who are interested in serving as Post Officers starting at the June 2020 membership meeting until June 2021.

A brief overview of each position follows:

Commander: Presides over the Post meetings, supervises the business affairs of the Post and serves as Chief Executive Officer, provides an annual report and list of newly installed officers to the State. Chairs the Executive Committee.

1st Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander assume his duties. The 1st Vice Commander is responsible for the Post membership drive.

2nd Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander and the 1st Vice Commander, assume their duties. Is responsible for the Americanism programs i.e. Oratorical Contest, Boys State, ROTC, etc.

3rd Vice Commander: In the absence of the Commander and the 1st and 2nd Vice Commander, assume their duties. Chairs the House Committee and supervises the Club Management. →

Chaplain: Promotes the spiritual welfare of the Post. Offers divine non-sectarian services at Post events. Chairs the Visiting Committee.

Historian: In charge of records and incidents of the Post and its members.

Sergeant-At-Arms: Preserves order at meetings, serves as Post color bearer.

Three Year Trustee: Serves for three years. Along with the One Year and Two Year Trustees assist with Post budget, enforce Post financial policy, conducts an annual Post inventory and are custodians of Post property. One Year trustee chairs the Building Committee.

Reopening the Post

A special meeting was conducted regarding reopening the Post.

Redstone designates entry lane for beneficiaries seeking COVID-19 tests

REDSTONE ARSENAL – Redstone Arsenal is implementing additional health and safety changes at our gates to protect our community and guards from the spread of COVID-19.

As of Tuesday, March 31, beneficiaries (active duty military, retirees and their dependents) accessing Redstone Arsenal with the intent to be tested for COVID-19 at Fox Army Health Center are being asked to utilize Gate 9 (Rideout Rd.), lane 8 for access.

Guards manning Gate 9, lane 8 may be wearing additional Personal Protective Equipment as they assist beneficiaries with accessing the installation for treatment. The Guard Force on this lane will only process vehicles and occupants through the Access Control Point. They will continue to ask the driver to hold and flip their own access badge to maintain a safe social distance. Guards will not be executing any medical checks at the gates. Redstone is coordinating with leadership across the installation and our local community partners to ensure we provide the most up-to-date information to our workforce.

Redstone Arsenal is continuing to conduct operations at this time, and is assessing adjustments to services based on demand. If the status of the installation changes, we will notify the workforce through direct communication, the Redstone Rocket, Team Redstone social media and websites, the Redstone Explorer App and local media. Employees are encouraged to keep in contact with their direct supervisory chain and leadership for information updates specific to their organization.

Honor Guard News

As prevalent and important as the Covid-19 Virus news is and as much as it has curtailed events at Post 237, an excerpt from a recent League of POW/MIA families, now in it's 51st year of working with the DPAA on locating and accounting for the 1587 Americans unaccounted for in the Vietnam conflict is something every Legionnaire and member of the Honor Guard is vitally concerned about. Here we would like to pass on some positive news.

POW/MIA FLAG TO BE DISPLAYED YEAR-ROUND: On November 7th, President Trump signed into law the "National POW/MIA Flag Act," a measure introduced by **Representatives Jack Bergman, (R-MI)** and **Chris Pappas (D-NH)** on March 7, 2019. The League-originated POW/MIA flag is now required to be displayed whenever the American flag is posted on prominent federal properties, including the White House, US Capitol, World War II Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, National Vietnam Veterans Memorial, every national cemetery, the buildings containing the official offices of the Secretaries of State, Defense and Veterans Affairs, office of the Director of the Selective Service system, each major military installation, each Department of Veterans Affairs medical center and each office of the US Postal Service. →

The League is grateful for this tremendous level of support, a meaningful signal to all nations that America stands behind and with those who serve – past, present and future – and if captured or missing, all possible efforts will be made to recover and bring home our UNRETURNED Veterans.

Chairman's Comment: Despite many challenges, including continuing structural dysfunction within DPAA, there is reason for cautious optimism. With sustained support from the families and our nation's veterans, the League is determined to press for priority and answers on Vietnam War accounting, as pledged by DPAA Director Kelly McKeague. The League also supports field investigation and recovery of unaccounted-for personnel from WWII, the Korean War and the Cold War as a priority over disinterment and ID of remains buried as "unknowns" in US cemeteries at home and abroad, so long as Vietnam War accounting efforts remain DPAA's operational priority.
