The RoundUp App

As a Veteran's Service Organization our American Legion Post 237 has an obligation to provide first-class services to our North Alabama Veterans. To create a first-class service organization our Post needs a consistent revenue stream that will fund the necessary budget items for our Veterans and enable us to support our charitable programs.

Our Post Finance Office has investigated and vetted one resource to put our Post on a track to self sufficient funding. The RoundUp App is an easy way for our members and supporters to help fund our Post and service budget. The RoundUp app can be downloaded on your PC, phone or tablet. There are no initial costs to use the RoundUp app.

The RoundUp program will round up each purchase on a linked card to the next dollar for the purchases you make within the month. For example if you spend \$10.25 at the hardware store, the app will round up that purchase by 75 cents to \$11. At the end of the month the app will deposit all of your round ups into our Post account less a 1% service fee.

The RoundUp App will work on any valid credit or debit card on all purchases made with that card. A normal credit card user will end up making between \$10 and \$20 in donation to the Post every month. If we have only 200 members contributing \$10 per month with this program, we will net \$1,800 per month after deducting the 1% RoundUp service fee. Users can establish donation limits on the app, make one-time donations and easily send a link to friends and family who may want to help us.

Your personal credit information is not stored within the app and RoundUp has no access to that information. The app uses the financial transaction company Stripe to validate your information. Stripe is used by many of the larger e-commerce corporations.

Veterans can download the RoundUp app and easily setup an account. If you need assistance with download the app or establishing an account please contact the Finance Office. We will make ourselves available to help you set up your account.

American Legion Invites High School Students To Compete In Speech Contest

High school students of Madison County, AL have been invited by The American Legion Posts in the county to compete in the 85th Annual American Legion High School Oratorical Scholarship Program.

The Oratorical Contest presents our county high school students with an academic speaking challenge that teaches important leadership skills, the history of the nation's laws, the ability to think and speak clearly and an understanding of the duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship.

The subject in the prepared oration portion of the contest must be about some phase of the Constitution of the United States, emphasizing the duties and obligations of a citizen to the United States government. The contest will also include an assigned subject allowing the contestants to briefly speak on a specific Constitutional matter.

The first level of competition will start at 10:00 AM, January 22, 2022 at Madison City Hall, 100 Hughes Road, Madison, Alabama 35758. Contestants must arrive by 9:30 for briefing. The winner of the Madison County competition will be eligible to advance in the contest to the District, Division, and State of Alabama levels of competition.

There will be monetary awards presented at each level of competition for the first three places. The winner at each level will progress to the next level. The State of Alabama winner will be awarded scholarships of \$2,500, \$1,500 and \$1,000 for the top three places, respectively. The winner of the Alabama competition will advance to the National finals which will be held in Indianapolis in April, 2022.

At the National level, there will be three levels of competition: Round 1, Round 2 and Final. Each state winner who competes in the first round of the national contest will receive a \$2,000 scholarship. Participants in the second round who do not advance to the national final round will receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship. The top three youth orators who have won all previous elimination rounds of the contest will receive college scholarships of \$25,000, \$22,500, and \$20,000, respectively.

The American Legion will pay travel and lodging expenses of state winners at the national contest.

The contest for Madison County students has been arranged with the cooperation of local school officials. Contact your Career/College Counselor for more information.

Madison County high-schoolers who are interested in entering the competition will find complete rules and contest information at www.legion.org/oratorical. HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS **SEMPER FI**

The U. S. Marine Corps birthday celebrates the history, memory of those who served before and rekindles the bond that unites all generations of Marines. It is a celebration of the profound respect for the Marine Corps traditions and reverence of the heritage that distinguishes the Corps of Marines. On November 10, 2021, the Marine Corps turns 245 years old.

History of the Marine Corps Birthday: The birthday itself was formally recognized in 1921, at the behest of Major General John Lejeune, who ordered November 10, 1775, to be officially recognized service-wide as the Marine Corps birthday. The origins go back to the Revolutionary War in October 1775. At that time the Continental Congress developed an official plan to use Marines to oversee a mission to intercept ammunition shipments from Britain. This, and a November resolution to create an official standing Marine Corps force, were key in building what eventually became the modern U.S. Marine Corps. Thus, November 10, 1775, the day the Continental Marines were created serves as the official Marine Corps birthday.

Establishment of the Marines Corps as a Separate Branch of Military Service: In the late 1700s, piracy had forced another look at using naval warfare to project the military power of the United States. At this time, the Marines still operated under the U. S. Navy, which itself operated under the Secretary of War. Legislation to make the U. S. Navy its own department came in 1798, with more legislation to establish the U. S. Marines as its own branch of service enacted later that same year.

Celebrating the Marine Corps Birthday: The Marine Corps birthday is not a federal-style holiday observed with post office and bank closures, days off at school, etc. Instead, it is observed as an “internal” holiday by the various branches of the military, with local government and civic organizations holding events to celebrate the men and women who have served as United States Marines. Formal dinners and Birthday Balls in Washington D.C. and on military installations worldwide are part of the recognition of Marine Corps Day.

Marine Corps Birthday Ball: The Marine Corps Birthday Ball is a celebration of Marine Corps history and traditions. The first known Birthday Ball took place in Philadelphia in 1925 and has since evolved from a simple observance to an elaborate and tradition-filled day celebrated at military installations at home and abroad. During the Birthday Ball a highlight of the evening is a ceremony. A key piece of the Marine Corps birthday celebration includes a cake cutting in celebration of the Corps. While there is no exact format the general script involves cutting the cake with a Mameluke sword which gets its name from the cross hilt and ivory grip design and its use in Marine Corps operations dates back to 1805. The first piece of cake is generally given to the guest of honor and the second piece of cake goes to the oldest Marine present. The oldest Marine will often pass the cake to the youngest Marine to symbolize the passing of knowledge and experience. The ceremony typically also includes speeches, the reading of General John A. Lejeune’s birthday message, and a birthday message from the current Commandant.

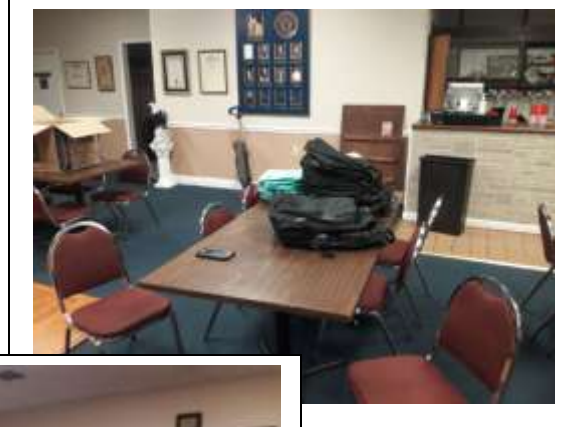

Post 237 Participates in the North Alabama Veterans and Fraternal Organization Coalition Anniversary Celebration

On Wednesday 6 Oct., 1st V. Cdr. Dr. Michael Kinney, Adj. Mary McCoy, Hist. Ken Carpenter, Auxiliary Sec. Michele Kinney, and SAL member & Legion Baseball Coach Rick Bragg attended the North Alabama Veterans and Fraternal Organization Coalition's 20th Anniversary Founder's Day Luncheon, held at the Summit, on Redstone Arsenal. Each of the member organizations displayed their membership and information materials on tables provided by the NAV&FC. Adj. McCoy and Sec. Kinney managed Post 237's impressive display at its table. Particularly creative was the innovative door prize program which required the participant to have each of the organizations present to initial the participant's visit to that groups' display table to qualify for the door prize.

The NAV&FCC is an umbrella organization of fifty affiliate members including military veteran's, active & retired military, first responders, and fraternal organizations. Among its many functions, it coordinates membership events to avoid conflicting event calendar dates (Navfoc.org).

An elegant buffet dinner was followed by a memorable address by LTG/Ret. William 'Bill' Phillips. LTG Philips spoke of the valor of four Korean War soldiers including U.S. Army Chaplain, Capt. Father Emil Kapuan. Father Kapuan severed in World War Two, and the Korean War. Chaplain Kapuan died of malnutrition and pneumonia in a North Korean POW camp at Pyoktong, in 1951. For his devoted service to his fellow soldiers under fire, and to his fellow POWs, he has been awarded the Medal of Honor, and is venerated by the Roman Catholic faith as a Servant of God.
