FROM THE 3RD VICE COMMANDER

As you all know with inflation being what it is, the price we pay for almost all items we purchase has been increasing, sometimes drastically. Poppy Pride

The devastation had scarce begun when in 1915 a Canadian physician stood near the grave of a fallen friend and gazed out on the red poppies blowing in the wind between the rows of crosses. He penned a poem in honor his friend that we now know as, "In Flanders Fields".

In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie,
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.

Four years later an armistice was being signed in France. However, the poppies were gone, and the around Ypres was a muddy, uninhabitable moonscape devoid of trees, cut by trenches, and dotted with craters. The scarred fields churned by bombs grew nothing but sorrow.

Legend has it that Lt. Col. McCrea's poem was retrieved from the trash by his fellow soldiers. It was used as a call to duty and sacrifice in honor of who had those already fallen. The red poppy of his poetry was christened the Remembrance Poppy. It remains a potent symbol of gratitude and honor for fallen soldiers throughout the western world.

Like the resurrected verse, the fields of poppies returned to life. The field hallowed by the graves of nearly twelve thousand soldiers, over eight thousand of which are unnamed. The red poppies still grace the rows of white headstones and monuments of the Tyne Cot cemetery in Flanders Field. →

In 1922, some two and a half years after the armistice, when the fields were green once more. King George V of England made a pilgrimage to the nearly completed cemetery in Flanders Fields. He went there to honor the dead. In his speech, he spoke not only of the sacrifice which the poppies called to mind, but also about the hope of a lesson learned from them.

"I have many times asked myself whether there can be more potent advocates of peace upon Earth through the years to come, than this massed multitude of silent witnesses to the desolation of war."

Not far from Tyne Cot in France is the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery and Memorial, the final resting place of 14,246 U.S. servicemen. It is the largest American cemetery in Europe. None of those who stood alongside the men who died in Flanders Fields are with us anymore except in spirit and memory. This Veteran's Day red poppies will, once again, take us to the hallowed place of remembrance of those who served and continue to serve and they will live again in our hearts.

We are the American Legion. We remember. In that remembrance the kindred spirit we share with both the living and the dead will bring new strength to our fellowship while we continue serving our community.

Honor Guard Call to Arms

The Post 237 Honor Guard has dwindled down to about half as many members as it once had. Over the past few years, deaths, members moving away, medical issues or just plain old age has taken its toll on the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard has been able to maintain operations without denying any request for services, but at times we have had a limited number of available members. In the past two years we have provided over 200 military funerals, averaging about two per week. We are on call seven days a week. Many of our members have full time jobs and can participate only on the weekends, leaving the full-time retirees to fend for the weekdays. We combine efforts with the Post 229 Honor Guard to fulfill the funeral requests and maintain a perfect record. Our goal is to have enough members to rotate so that no one person must do all the funerals. We need your help to make this happen.

If you feel duty bound to pay your respects to veterans in their passing, join the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard will issue you a summer and winter uniform with all accessories. All you have to provide is your American legion cap and a pair of black shoes. Transportation from Post 237 to the assignment and back is provided by the Post 237 van. The rifle salute uses M1 Garand rifles of WWII vintage that have been restored.
