## POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY

On September 17, 2021 Americans will pause to remember the U.S. servicemembers who never came home, either living or dead. The third Friday of September is designated as POW/MIA Recognition Day to honor those U.S. servicemembers that are either prisoners of war or still missing in action. The day is one of six in which Congress mandates the flying of the POW/MIA flag. The other days are: Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day.

The American Legion is committed to achieving a full accounting of all POW/MIAs from all war eras. This means returning living POWs, the repatriation of their remains, or finding convincing evidence of why neither is possible.

Resolution No. 288, adopted at the 67<sup>th</sup> American Legion National Convention, calls for designating a POW/MIA Empty Chair at all official Legion meetings as a physical symbol of the thousands of American POW/MIAs still unaccounted for. The Legion's commitment to this issue was re-emphasized at the 94<sup>th</sup> National Convention in Indianapolis. Resolution No. 78 states that "The American Legion remains steadfast in our commitment to the goal of achieving the fullest possible accounting for all U.S. military personnel and designated civilian personnel missing and unaccounted for from our nation's wars."

Another symbol on display in American Legion Posts is the POW/MIA Table as shown here. This small table occupies a place of dignity and honor. It is set for one, symbolizing the fact that members of our armed forces are missing from our ranks. We call them comrades. They are unable to be with their loved ones and families, so we join together to pay humble tribute to them, and to bear witness to their continued absence. →

The table is small, symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner, alone against his or her suppressors. The tablecloth is white, symbolic of the purity of their intentions to respond to their Country's call to arms. The single rose in the vase signifies the blood they may have shed in sacrifice to ensure the freedom of our beloved United States of America. This rose also reminds us of the family and friends of our missing comrades who keep faith, while awaiting their return. The red ribbon on the vase represents an unyielding determination for a proper accounting of our comrades who are not among us. A slice of lemon on the plate reminds us of their bitter fate. The salt sprinkled on the plate reminds us of the countless fallen tears of families as they wait. The glass is inverted, they cannot toast with us at this time. The chair is empty. They are **NOT** here. The candle is reminiscent of the light of hope, which lives in our hearts to illuminate their way home, away from their captors to the open arms of a grateful nation. The American flag reminds us that many of them may never return---and have paid the supreme sacrifice to insure our freedom.

In May 2020 the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency reported that 81,900 Americans were still considered MIA: 72,598 from World War II, 7,580 from the Korean War, 1,587 from Vietnam, 126 from the Cold War and six from conflicts since 1991. Let us remember---and never forget their sacrifice. May God forever watch over them and protect them and their families.

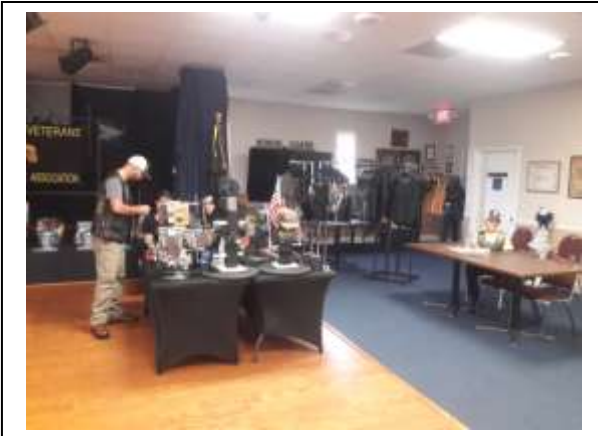
