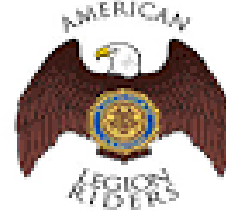

### Post 237 Smoking Survey Results

Thanks to all who participated in the 2023 Post 237 Smoking Survey. There were 195 responses; 73% said the Post should be non-smoking and 27% said the Post should be smoking. If the Post were non-smoking 56% said they would visit the Post more often, 19% less often, and 24% about the same.

## **GOLD STAR MOTHER'S AND FAMILY'S DAY**

### **DAY**

On September 28, 1936, a joint congressional resolution designated the last Sunday in September as Gold Star Mother's Day and it is proclaimed annually by each president. In 2011, President Obama amended the day to "Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day."

The history of National Gold Star Mother's Day and their families begins with the United States thrown into the midst of a great war. Army Captain Robert L. Queissner, whose two sons were serving on the front line during World War I, created what is now called the Service Flag. The flag was displayed with a blue star to represent a child serving in the military during times of war or hostilities. When a service member died, families stitched a gold star over the blue star. It is a tradition to honor a fallen service member with a gold star indicating a family member has been lost while serving during a period of conflict or war in which the United States is engaged. The gold star is placed over the blue star creating a blue border. The gold star represents valor and sacrifice to the cause of liberty and freedom. The blue border is a faithful reminder that the service member will always be remembered and honored.

The American Gold Star Mother, Inc. was incorporated in 1929. An ocean often divided families from their deceased sons, as was the case of the founder of this organization. While waiting for confirmation of her son's death, she visited the VA hospital almost daily and made herself useful. Afterward, she continued to visit the hospital and formed the organization that unites gold star mothers still today.

On this day we can express our gratitude and respect for our nation's Gold Star Mothers and Families. They are the mothers and immediate family members of fallen military service members. Please encourage all Americans to honor these Mothers and Families. →



### **How to Honor and Recognize Them:**

One of the best ways to honor Gold Star Families is if you see someone wearing a Gold Star Pin, or see a Gold Star Banner hanging in their window, ask the person who the star is for, and what is their Star's name. Do not be afraid to ask them about their Star; if you say their name they are never forgotten. Pierre Claeysens said it best, "To be killed in war is not the worst that can happen. To be lost is not the worst. To be forgotten is the worst."

Another thing when honoring a Gold Star Mother and Family is to refrain from applauding. You must remember these moments are hard for mothers and families as they remember their loved ones who are no longer with us. We can honor them through ceremonies, luncheons and teas. We can honor them with a simple thank you, a thinking of you card, a citation and a moment of silence for their loved one. We can honor them outdoors at a war, veteran or military memorial site. So please honor these mothers and families the best way you can.

I challenge you to find your local Gold Star Mother's and Families and recognize them. Let them know that we will never forget.

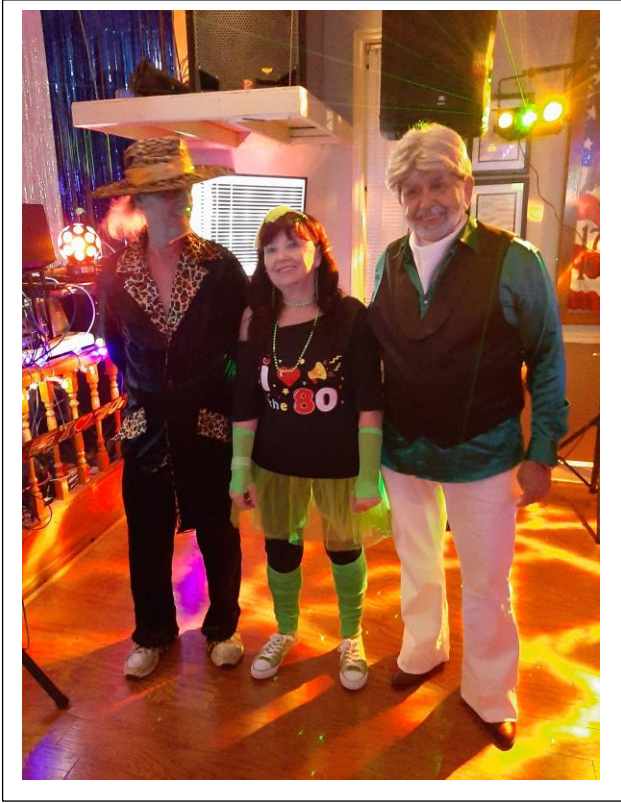

The Huntsville American Legion Clayton E. Moneymaker Post 237 and Post 229 Honor Guard provide military funeral services for area military veterans. From June 2021 through March, 2022, your Post Honor Guard, consisting of volunteers, has provided this service to more than ninety families. In addition, the Honor Guard performs flag ceremonies for various civic affairs, such as Memorial Day, and other requested services.

This memorable service is provided to veteran's families at no charge, and receives no funding from outside the Post membership. The annual costs (transportation, vehicle maintenance and insurance, etc.) for the Honor Guard is approximately \$5,000 per year. Please assist your Honor Guard.

Tax deductible donations can be mailed to Alabama American Legion Post 237, P.O. Box 1176, Huntsville, AL 35807 or dropped off at the Post. Please note on the check or the envelope that the donation is intended for the Honor Guard. The Post 237 Honor Guard is now classified as a 501C3 organization and its official name is The American Legion - Alabama Post 237 - Honor Guard. **Honor Guard Call to Arms**

The Post 237 Honor Guard has dwindled down to about half as many members as it once had. Over the past few years, deaths, members moving away, medical issues or just plain old age has taken its toll on the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard has been able to maintain operations without denying any request for services, but at times we have had a limited number of available members. In the past two years we have provided over 200 military funerals, averaging about two per week. We are on call seven days a week. Many of our members have full time jobs and can participate only on the weekends, leaving the full-time retirees to fend for the weekdays. We combine efforts with the Post 229 Honor Guard to fulfill the funeral requests and maintain a perfect record. Our goal is to have enough members to rotate so that no one person must do all the funerals. We need your help to make this happen.

If you feel duty bound to pay your respects to veterans in their passing, join the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard will issue you a summer and winter uniform with all accessories. All you have to provide is your American legion cap and a pair of black shoes. Transportation from Post 237 to the assignment and back is provided by the Post 237 van. The rifle salute uses M1 Garand rifles of WWII vintage that have been restored.
