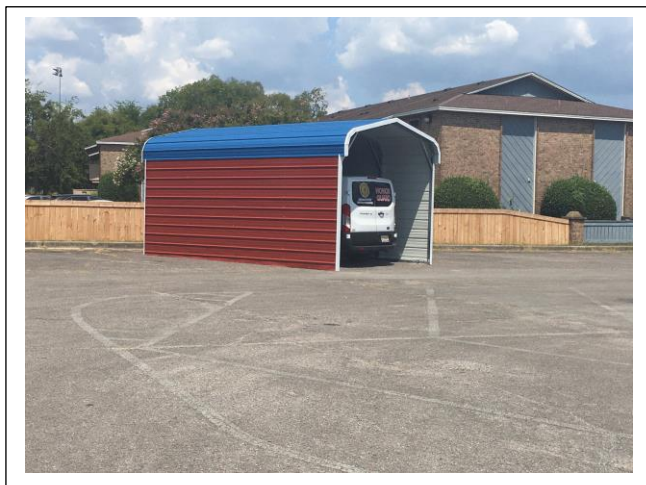
Wednesday Game Nights: Game night at the Post! We will be continuing the Left, Right, Center dice tournament on the Patio starting at 6 PM.

POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY



On September 20, 2024 Americans will pause to remember the U.S. service members who never came home, either living or dead. The third Friday of September is designated as POW/MIA Recognition Day to honor those U.S. service members that are either prisoners of war or still missing in action. The day is one of six in which Congress mandates the flying of the POW/MIA flag. The other days are: Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day.

The American Legion is committed to achieving a full accounting of all POW/MIAs from all war eras. This means returning living POWs, the repatriation of their remains, or finding convincing evidence of why neither is possible. Resolution No. 288, adopted at the 67th American Legion National Convention, calls for designating a POW/MIA Empty Chair at all official Legion meetings as a physical symbol of the thousands of American POW/MIAs still unaccounted for. The Legion's commitment to this issue was re-emphasized at the 94th National Convention in Indianapolis. Resolution No. 78 states that "The American Legion remains steadfast in our commitment to the goal of achieving the fullest possible accounting for all U.S. military personnel and designated civilian personnel missing and unaccounted for from our nation's wars."

Another symbol on display in American Legion Posts is the POW/MIA Table as shown here. This small table occupies a place of dignity and honor. It is set for one, symbolizing the fact that members of our armed forces are missing from our ranks. We call them comrades. They are unable to be with their loved ones and families, so we join together to pay humble tribute to them, and to bear witness to their continued absence. The table is small, symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner, alone against his or her suppressors. The tablecloth is white, symbolic of the purity of their intentions to respond to their Country's call to arms. The single rose in the vase signifies the blood they may have shed in sacrifice to ensure the freedom of our beloved United States of America. This rose also reminds us of the family and friends of our missing comrades who keep faith, while awaiting their return. The red ribbon on the vase represents an unyielding determination for a proper accounting of our comrades who are not among us. A slice of lemon on the plate reminds us of their bitter fate. The salt sprinkled on the plate reminds us of the countless fallen tears of families as they wait. The glass is inverted, they cannot toast with us at this time. The chair is empty. They are **NOT** here. The candle is reminiscent of the light of hope, which lives in our hearts to illuminate their way home, away from their captors to the open arms of a grateful nation. The American flag reminds us that many of them may never return---and have paid the supreme sacrifice to insure our freedom.

In March 2024 the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency reported that there are 81,245 Americans who remain missing from WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Cold War, and the Gulf Wars/other conflicts. The Vietnam War itself has 1,575 Americans who are identified as missing and unaccounted for as of June 2024.

Let us remember---and never forget their sacrifice. May God forever watch over them and protect them and their families.

The Last Full Measure
Post 237 Article: A1C Pitsenbarger

U.S. Air Force, Medal of Honor Recipient. A1C WILLIAM H. PITSENBARGER

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE, for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty near Cam My, April 11, 1966: **Rank and organization:** Airman First Class, U.S. Air Force, Detachment 6, 38th Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Squadron, Bien Hoa Air Base, Republic of Vietnam.

Place and date: Near Cam My, April 11, 1966.. **Born:** July 8, 1944, Piqua, Ohio.

Entered service at: Piqua, Ohio

Citation: Airman First Class William Pitsenbarger distinguished himself by extreme valor on April 11, 1966 near Cam My, Republic of Vietnam, while assigned as a Pararescue Crew Member, Detachment 6, 38th Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Squadron. On that date, Airman Pitsenbarger was aboard a rescue helicopter responding to a call for evacuation of casualties incurred in an on-going firefight between elements of the United States Army's 1st Infantry Division and a sizable enemy force approximately 35 miles east of Saigon. **With complete disregard for personal safety, Airman William Pitsenbarger volunteered to ride a hoist more than one hundred feet through the jungle, to the ground. On the ground, he organized and coordinated rescue efforts, cared for the wounded, prepared casualties for evacuation, and insured that the recovery operation continued in a smooth and orderly fashion. Through his personal efforts, the evacuation of the wounded was greatly expedited. As each of the nine casualties evacuated that day were recovered, William Pitsenbarger refused evacuation in order to get one more wounded soldier to safety. After several pick-ups, one of the two rescue helicopters involved in the evacuation was struck by heavy enemy ground fire and was forced to leave the scene for an emergency landing. Airman William Pitsenbarger stayed behind, on the ground, to perform medical duties. Shortly thereafter, the area came under sniper and mortar fire. During a subsequent attempt to evacuate the site, American forces came under heavy assault by a large Viet Cong force. When the enemy launched the assault, the evacuation was called off and Airman William Pitsenbarger took up arms with the besieged infantrymen. He courageously resisted the enemy, braving intense gunfire to gather and distribute vital ammunition to American defenders. As the battle raged on, he repeatedly exposed himself to enemy fire to care for the wounded, pull them out of the line of fire, and return fire whenever he could, during which time, he was wounded three times. Despite his wounds, he valiantly fought on, simultaneously treating as many wounded as possible. In the vicious fighting which followed, the American forces suffered 80 percent casualties as their perimeter was breached, and airman William Pitsenbarger was finally fatally wounded. Airman William Pitsenbarger exposed himself to almost certain death by staying on the ground, and perished while saving the lives of wounded infantrymen. His bravery and determination exemplify the highest professional standards and traditions of military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Air Force.**

Medal of Honor Award.

Soon after Pitsenbarger was killed, his Air Force commanders nominated him for the Medal of Honor. An Army general recommended that the award be downgraded to the Air Force Cross, apparently because at the time there was not enough documentation of Pitsenbarger's actions.

Finally, his Medal of Honor was presented to his parents on 8 Dec. 2000, at the Air Force Museum, Wright Patterson AFB, Dayton, OH., by the Sec. of the Air Forces. He is buried in Miami Memorial Park Cemetery in Covington, OH. His medal is held at the USAF Pararescue & Combat Officer School, Kirkland AFB, NM.

A handsome statue of Airman Pitsenbarger was erected (2015) in his hometown of Piqua. Airman Pitsenbarger is **the 59th Medal of Honor recipient**, and **the sixth enlisted recipient**, for the **Air Force and its predecessor organizations**.

Movie: “The Last Full Measure”,

I was made aware of this heroic, inspirational and caring young Airman by a television viewing of the 2019-2020 movie **“The Last Full Measure”**. The focus of the movie is a fictional account of a DOD civilian who at first reluctantly, and later actively pursues, interviews of veterans involved, which resulted in the awarding of the Medal of Honor. A movie review by VVA Veteran Arts Editor and Senior Writer, Marc Leepson, notes that “the movie falls down, in most of the 1990s scenes ...” concerning the fictional DOD civilian; and that the movie is “partly true and partly fictitious ... both inspiring and deflating, and both heartwarming and cloying” .

Despite standard criticisms about how unrealistic “war movies” are, I maintain such films inspire us to honor our gallant known and unknown service personnel and to explore true accounts of such “fiction based on fact” stories.

Personal Note:

I have a particular interest in learning of the accounts of our honorable U.S. military medical personnel: medics, corpsmen, nurses and doctors. In 1966, with my family, I often visited by brother, A1C, Oren P. “Duff” Carpenter while he under the excellent care of the medical staff of the Montgomery Maxwell AFB hospital. He passed away (age 24) of cancer on 3 Nov., 1966, after being transported from the AFB in Izmir, Turkey, to Frankfurt, Germany, to Ft. Dix, NJ (where we were with him), and then home to Alabama. His funeral was attended by some of the Maxwell hospital staff. Their devoted service inspired me to serve as a USN/USNR Hospital Corpsman.
